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SELECTED REPORTABLE DISEASES

Reportable Diseases incidence in Van Buren and Cass Counties is included on page 2. This is a five year report for both counties combined.

Our Chlamydia and Gonorrhea rates remain high. The apparent Campylobacter increase is most likely due to recent enhanced testing by some labs. Varicella remains primarily reported by individual cases through the schools. The majority of cases are mild.

We have not had significant foodborne illness outbreaks (thankfully!). Hepatitis C remains our most frequent chronic infectious disease.

RABIES POST EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS NOW REDUCED BY ONE DOSE

This series of injections has been reduced from five to four. A regimen of 4 one-ml vaccine doses of rabies vaccine (HDCV or PCECV) should be administered intramuscularly to previously unvaccinated persons with no immuno-suppression. The first dose of the 4-dose course should be administered as soon as possible after exposure. This date is considered day 0 of the post-exposure prophylaxis series. Additional doses should then be administered on days, 3, 7, and 14 after the first vaccination. Considerations for the site of the intramuscular vaccination remain unchanged. The recommendations for use of immune globulin remain unchanged.
